Traumatic Cardiac Arrest-A Different Beast

T raumatic cardiac arrest (TCA) should be thought of in a different treatment paradigm than medical cardiac arrest (MCA). This presentation will focus on the key principles of diagnosis and approach to-TCA with emphasis on the vital differences and subsequent management in pathophysiology between -TCA and MCA.
